

Greetings Philatelists,

This issue of the Bulletin is the Spring Show Issue. This is where we welcome Exhibitors and Dealers for two days of immersion in philately related activities. We extend an especially warm welcome to the judges and our out of town dealers and show participants.

The life of a stamp collector and by implication the stamp market can be roughly divided into three phases: starting with hunting for and acquiring collectible items. This is followed by incorporating, organizing, and consolidating and lastly there is the selling phase. The Spring Show provides an opportunity to meet face to face with and get to know dealers that would otherwise remain just a name or business contact. This helps with acquisition. The exhibits provide inspiration to those who would like to develop their philatelic treasures into thematic collections. This helps with consolidation. And finally the selling part. This is an activity that at the Edmonton Stamp Club is well developed. It is pursued at every meeting through the provision of members' auctions, being Silent (30 lots), Estate (30 lots), or Regular (max 100 lots). In addition, there will again be a summer auction on the last Monday of July. It goes without saying that these auctions are great for acquiring new material.

The middle phase of organization and consolidation is only made visible at club meetings by the talks that club members provide. Support for this phase of stamp collecting could use some strengthening in our club. Public speaking is not for everyone. Perhaps the use of social media could fill a need through posting of scans of pages from someone's collection complete with commentary. This is not yet a reality for the Edmonton Stamp Club but a society that wants to survive in the digital age certainly must start thinking about how to use the internet in all its aspects. Enjoy the show, don't overthink the ups and downs of catalog prices or percent of catalog. Finding the one piece that has eluded you for all those years is what makes your day. I wish you good luck.

Edmonton's Historic City Centre Airport made Edmonton the 'Gateway to the North'

Otherwise known as the Blatchford Airfield, the Edmonton Municipal Airport, connected all communities North of Edmonton by airplane. This service was pioneered by ex-WWI pilots. They were known as the Bush Pilots. They carried people, supplies and many other goods that needed to go to remote places.

The Hagmann Farm, Jimmy Bell's Air Harbour, Blatchford Field, #2 Air Observer School, RCAF Western Air Command, Industrial Airport, Municipal Airport - during the past 80 years, Edmonton City Centre Airport (ECCA) has had as many names as it has had roles.

Blatchford Field became the home of Edmonton's early bush pilots such as Punch Dickens and Wop May, whose adventures and exploits helped open the Canadian North to flight and lay the foundation for the commercial aviation industry that we rely on today. For the next 35 years, the airport was an important center of commercial and military aviation, not just for the Edmonton region, but also for all of Canada and North America. In 1939, operations were handed over to the Canadian government as the airport filled a critical role as a Royal Canadian Air Force flight-training center during the Second World War. In 1943, the North American record was set when 860 planes passed through what was at that time known as #2 Air Observer School.

ECCA still displays its proud history with the Heritage Walkway and Alberta Aviation Museum. Both are located on the southern boundary of the airport along Kingsway Avenue and are guarded by a magnificent 1960s-vintage CF-101 Voodoo jet fighter.

Racing

Beginning in 2005, the airport was annually converted into a speedway for the Edmonton Grand PrixChamp Car race. In 2008 Champ Car merged with the Indy Racing League, and became the IndyCar Series. The NASCAR Canadian Tire Series also raced at the speedway in 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, and 2012.

Beginning with the July 2011 event, the track layout was

Ed Kroft Q.C. CPA(HONS)

Ed Kroft lives in Vancouver. He serves as a national level judge of the RPSC and is a member of the Geldert Medal Committee of the RPSC.

Ed works as a tax lawyer and has collected stamps for over 50 years. He is the current President of the Society of Israel Philatelists (SIP) and has been actively involved with that society for many years. Ed has written many articles for various philatelic

Ed is a member of the RPSC, SIP, BNAPS, AAMS, Canadian Aerophilately Society, APS, the 21 Club, ONEPS, PHSC, PSSC and the Holy Land Philatelic Society. His philatelic collecting interests include Holy Land and Middle East Postal History and Aerophilately.



Sam G Chiu FRPSC

Sam collects mostly China, Hong Kong and some British Commonwealth countries. He is an accredited FIP (PH and PS) and RPSC jury. He is also a Fellow of the Royal Philatelic Society of Canada. He served on Canada Post's Stamp Advisory Committee for two terms.

In early 1990's, he was asked by the RCMP to be the expert witness in a case

involving the forgery of Chinese souvenir sheets in Toronto. He co-wrote *Postage Due and the handling of Underpaid mail of Hong Kong*. Sam, together with several China postal history collectors, started the *Postal History Society of China*. He has received at least a gold medal in 6 different classes at the national level exhibitions (PH/PS/traditional/thematic/aero/1-frame).

John Keenlyside, FRPSC, FRPSL

John has served several terms as a director of the Royal Philatelic Society of Canada and the British North America Philatelic Society. His active collections include Colonial Vancouver Island and British Columbia postal history and the development of the Canadian Pacific Railway. He also enjoys pioneer postcards illustrating the early settlement of the Vancouver area. John is a lifelong resident of Vancouver



having majored in economics and political science at UBC. In 1973 he established an investment counselling firm and continues to enjoy managing client accounts with his sons Peter and Chris. John and his wife Wendy recently celebrated their 50th Wedding Anniversary.

reconfigured to use a more northeasterly section of the airport,

including the then permanently closed runway 16/34. The last Grand Prix was held in 2012.

Closure and redevelopment

On July 8, 2009, the city council decided on a phased closure of the airport. In September, the city council postponed the closure of the north-south runway until after the Indy and Airfest events of 2010. On August 3, 2010, runway 16/34 was closed to air traffic with a NOTAM (Notice to Airmen) being issued at 3 am that morning. Current licenses for scheduled air service were not renewed. Closure of the remaining runway was announced at an Edmonton City Council meeting on September 26, 2013. The last airplane to leave the airfield was a <u>Cessna 172</u>, owned and piloted by a local, on the afternoon of November 30, 2013.



I trade Canadian stamps to fellow stamp collectors overseas. Many of them want to receive one of every stamp issued each year. In December after the Christmas issue was available I sent out the last of the Canadian stamps for 2015. I received replies informing me that I had missed sending them the complete set of Discovery of the Franklin ship HMS Erebus. I checked Scotts and discovered to my surprise that I was in error. I had not included the stamps, Scott # 2851- 2852, Fig 1. They are a pair of the "Permanent"



nondenominational stamps printed in the old style stamp format using gum that require licking before placing them on the envelope. This surprised me because if my local franchised post office had received these stamp he would have certainly sold them to me. I usually pay close attention to Canada Post's publication "Details". Perhaps I missed seeing the necessary information. I went to the main post office in Edmonton to see if they had these stamps. I was

very abruptly told that these stamps are only available in booklet form. I then ventured into the Canada Post web site. It is sufficient to say that I did not have a joyful or satisfying experience. I then phoned Canada Post's Philatelic Customer Service to order these stamps as part of my total stamp order.

The service agent that I received looked into the computer and told me that these permanent stamps only come in booklet form. I explained that is not the information that I have. The Erebus stamps also must be available in a pane of probably 25 stamps. This stamp Continued page 21





After further discussion I asked him if he had ever seen sheets of stamps. The light bulb went on and he said that he had found them. I ordered two sheets. I must have flustered him because he did not go over my order, give me the total cost, delivery date etc. of the usual order closure process.



Two weeks later I received my stamp order that included my two sheets of Erebus stamps, souvenir sheets, Fig 2. I was on my best behavior when I again called the Canada Post's Philatelic Customer Service. The young lady who took my call looked on the first screen and could not find any information of pane of Erebus stamps. She continued the search and did find corner blocks for sale. Despite her best efforts she could not locate any information on the stamp sheets that produced the corner blocks. I ordered 20 corner blocks. Today I received the corner blocks so despite what Canada Post records indicate they did print sheets of the old lick and stick stamps for the HMS Erebus issue.
